Applicants for the Texas A&M University-Texarkana's Scholars of Practice doctoral program must have a master's degree in Education Leadership or a related field. Prerequisites for success include: dedication to growth as a scholar, commitment to continuous learning, evidence of effective leadership, and a strong academic background.
